Prof. Dr. Kathrin M. Möslein Chair of Information Systems I Innovation & Value Creation University Erlangen-Nuremberg (FAU)

Kathrin M. Moeslein is professor of information systems at the School of Business and Economics at the University of Erlangen-Nuremberg. She is also a professor of management and member of the team of directors at the Center for Leading Innovation & Cooperation

(CLIC) at HHL Leipzig Graduate School of Management. In addition, she serves as member of the advisory boards of the Peter Pribilla Foundation at the Technische Universität München (TUM), the Cambridge Service Alliance (CSA) at the University of Cambridge and the Fraunhofer IIS-SCS, Erlangen. Amongst others she is a founding member and has been a Vice President of the European Academy of Management (2006-2012). Kathrin has been researching, teaching and consulting in the field of strategic innovation and innovation systems since the early 1990s. Her current research focuses on the implementation of innovation strategies and technologies as well as leadership systems in service organizations.

Dr. Coutu is a specialist in aviation governance and strategic and performance management. He is an Accredited Airport Executive (A.A.E.) and holds a doctoral degree in

Education (Virtual Work Teams and Distance Education). After serving in various senior operational and administrative positions in public and para-public organizations in the aviation industry, in 1998 he stepped into the private arena and founded Aviation Strategies International (ASI) where he serves as Managing Director and Executive Director of the ASI Institute, which is an accredited ICAO Trainair Plus member. He also leads a dynamic team to carry out his role as the Administrator responsible for the design, development and global deployment of the ACI-ICAO Airport Management Professional Accreditation Programme (AMPAP) in addition to being the CEO of the ensuing International Airport Professional Community of Practice (IAP CoP) comprising AMPAP graduates.

In earlier years, Dr. Coutu directed the development of the ICAO-Concordia University Aviation Security (AVSEC) Management Certification Program as well as of the ACI-Concordia University Airport Executive Leadership Program (AELP), he was appointed to the Transportation Appeal Tribunal of Canada by the Minister of Transport of Canada, and he was the first recipient of the ACI Paul Genton Medal Award for his contribution to executive-level training in Aviation. He co-chaired the 1st World Aviation Governance Forum (WAGF) with United Nations' UNITAR-CIFAL and the Foundation for Sustainable Aviation and Tourism (FAST) and also co-authored the 3rd edition of "Airport Operations" (McGraw-Hill).



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
